Lieutenant Colonel Gerald J. Hall enlisted in the United States Army Reserve in April of 1987. In 1992 he was commissioned through the Reserve Officers' Training Corps at the University of Hawaii at Manoa. He then attended the Infantry Officer Basic Course at Ft Benning, Georgia before his assignment as an Anti-tank Platoon Leader in Delta Company, 100th Battalion, 442nd Infantry Regiment.

In 1997, he transitioned from the Army Reserve to the California Army National Guard where he served as the Company Executive Officer for Alpha Company, 2-159th IN (Mechanized), and later as Delta Company Commander. Upon transitioning back to the Army Reserve LTC Hall held other assignments to include Observer Controller Trainer in the 1st Brigade, 91st Training Support Division and later

with the 75th Battle Command Training Division.

In 2003, LTC Hall mobilized in support of Operation Nobel Eagle and deployed as part of Task Force ANA with the 10th Mountain Division under Operation Enduring Freedom. In September 2008, he mobilized to serve with the Headquarters Department of the Army Staff G-3/5/7 as a strategic stationing integrator to facilitate Army global stationing actions. In 2009, he was selected for the Army Congressional Orientation Program where he served as a military fellow for a Congressman on the House Armed Services Committee and the Terrorism, Unconventional Threats and Capabilities Subcommittee. In 2011, LTC Hall transitioned to the Active Guard Reserve and was assigned as the Force Development Officer for the 143rd Expeditionary Sustainment Command. In 2013, he was assigned as the Chief of Force Development at the 377th Theater Sustainment Command (TSC). While at the 377th TSC LTC Hall also served as the acting Special Troops Battalion commander.

LTC Hall's awards include the Army Staff Badge, Meritorious Service Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Commendation Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Reserve Overseas Training Ribbon with two Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, National Defense Service Medal with Bronze Star, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Achievement Medal with "M" and Silver Hourglass Device, Army Service Ribbon, Parachutist Badge, and Air Assault Badge.

LTC Hall's education includes a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of Hawaii, Master of Business Administration from University of Phoenix (Global Management), and a Juris Doctorate Degree from San Francisco Law School. He is also currently attending the U.S. Army War College (Distance Education).

LTC Hall's military schools include: Infantry Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Captain's Career Course, the Combined Arms Services Staff School, Combined General Staff College-Intermediate Level Education Course, Army Force Management FA50 qualification course.
