MEMORANDUM FOR US Army Garrison Fort Hunter Liggett (USAG FHL) and Parks Reserve Forces Training Area (PRFTA) Civilian and Military Personnel, Tenant Units, Contract Personnel, Residents, and Visitors

SUBJECT: FHL Policy #6, Systematic Vehicle Search/Inspections

1. REFERENCES:

- a. AR 190-13, Army Physical Security Program, 25 February 2011
- b. AR 525-13, Antiterrorism, 11 September 2008
- c. AR 190-56, Army Civilian Police and Security Guard Program, 15 October 2009
- d. AR 190-5, Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision, 22 May 2006
- e. AR 190-22, Searches, Seizures and Disposition of Property, 01 January 1983

2. APPLICABILITY: This policy applies to all members of the United States Armed Forces, Department of the Army civilian employees, tenant units, family members, Contract personnel, and visitors at FHL and PRFTA.

3. POLICY:

a. As the commander of USAG FHL, I am committed to the safety and welfare of everyone working, living, or visiting the Garrison. With the continued Overseas Contingency Operation, changes to the local threat can happen at any time. It is my intent to ensure random antiterrorism measures are applied effectively to ensure everyone's safety.

b. The Directorate of Emergency Services has overall responsibility for the conduct of random vehicle inspections.

c. The Antiterrorism Officer will develop recommendations for projected times, dates, and locations of inspections. The inspections will be identified and scheduled in advance and in accordance with the antiterrorism measures program. Random inspections will be developed and forwarded through the Deputy to the Garrison Commander for my approval.

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d. Vehicles may be stopped and inspected at installation gates, entry points, and in posted restricted areas. In addition, stops and searches are possible in other areas when there is a reasonable suspicion of criminal activity or violation of a traffic regulation.

e. Inspections will be conducted in compliance with this policy and Police Department standard operating procedures which outline specific instructions on how inspections will be organized and conducted.
