LEADING THE PACK: 80TH TASS TRAINING CENTER



80th TASS TTC



Seventeen million dollars is the price tag for the new building that would eventually house the 80th TTC here at Parks Reserve Forces Training Area in Dublin California. The modernization indicates the United States Army Reserve Command's (USARC) commitment to providing superior facilities and outstanding training environments for all Soldiers who work and train at PRFTA.

However, the first thing that students will notice is the close proximity to all the local transportation hubs that connect PRFTA to the major airports, highways and train stations. The Bay Area Transport (BART) stops just 5 minutes to the front gate of PRFTA. Also, for ease of transport the 80th provides bus service every two hours from Oakland and San Francisco International Airport during the travel and in-processing days.

"We get Soldiers from all over the world says Sharon Campbell, Team Chief, 80th TTC. They come from Guam to as far as Germany". In fact any Army Reserve or National Guard Soldier can come here to train. Soon, with the new facilities, active duty Soldiers may also attend.

The turn-key characteristic of attending training at PRFTA is what makes it so attractive. Unit Training NCO's can call or contact the cadre at the 80th and get a complete training package and be assured that Soldiers will arrive here safely to conduct training.

The school trains 42A, 36B, 68W and 92 Series MOS's and for Reserve Soldiers who go to basic training in the east and come here to complete their MOS training, PRFTA is a location with some pleasant surprises.

"Training here is a positive experience, said Campbell. "Our hard working cadre assist the students from start to finish. Students leave here trained in their MOS and ready to take on the challenges of their job."

Parks RFTA, is located in Northern California East Bay Area. The focus is on providing support for training individual Soldiers from around the country and providing a home for training support for units in and around the Bay Area. Also, PRFTA provides lodging, billeting for units, dining facilities and training venues. In all over 40,000 Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, and Marines train at Parks train on a yearly basis in everything from leadership development, nursing, culinary arts, administration and field operations.

Soldiers have access to a Chapel, Branch PX, Barber Shop, Gym, MWR services with a Community Activities Center. The CAC provides free computer access, discount tickets to movie theaters, sports events and organized off-post activities. Visiting families can use the on post lodging which is very competitive and reasonably priced.

MOS TRAINING AT PARKS RESERVE FORCES TRAINING AREA

42A: Personnel Services (10/30/40 Levels)

A Human Resources Specialist is responsible for providing support that affects Soldiers' overall welfare and well being, while assisting leaders with keeping Soldiers Combat ready and effective.

36B: Financial Management Technician (10 Level)

The finance management technician performs duties specific to the following financial management processes: budgeting, disbursing, and accounting for government funds; payment for travel and commercial vendor services; pay support of soldiers and foreign national employees; and internal control operations.

68W: Health Care Specialist (10, 40 Level)

The Health Care Specialist is primarily responsible for providing emergency medical treatment, limited primary care and health protection and evacuation from a point of injury or illness for Army Soldiers and civilians.

92A: Automated Logistics Specialist-Warehouse (10/30/40 Level)

The Automated Logistical Specialist is primarily responsible for supervising and performing management or warehouse functions in order to maintain equipment records and parts.

92Y: Supply Specialist (10/30/40 Level)

Petroleum Supply Specialists are primarily responsible for supervising and managing the reception, storage and shipping of bulk or packaged petroleum-based products.

92G: Food Service Specialist (10/30/40Level)

The Food Service Specialist is primarily responsible for the preparation and service of food in field or garrison food service operations.

92W: Water Supply Specialist (10/30/40 Level)

Water Treatment Specialists are primarily responsible for supervising or performing the installation and operation of water purification equipment, as well as dealing with water storage and distribution operations and activities.
